

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements Opinion:

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **AIC- NOVA FOUNDATION FOR AGRICULTURE INNOVATION AND RESEARCH** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2022, the Statement of Profit and Loss and Statement of Cash flow for the year ended 31st March, 2022, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

The Board of Directors are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

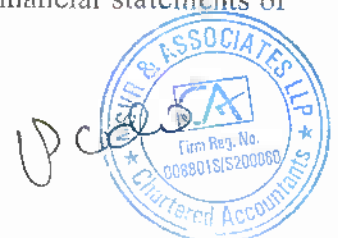
Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Company's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the Accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

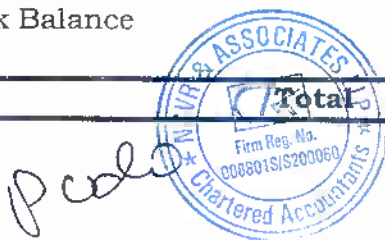

Note A: Significant Accounting Policies

1. Corporate Information:

2. Basis of preparation of financial Statements:

C. Impairment of Assets:

All Tangible and intangible assets are tested for impairment when there are indications that the carrying value may not be recoverable. There is no impairment loss for the year to be recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

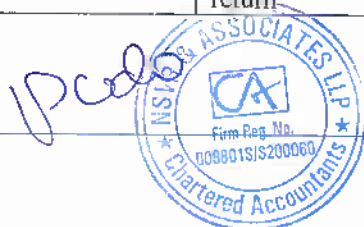

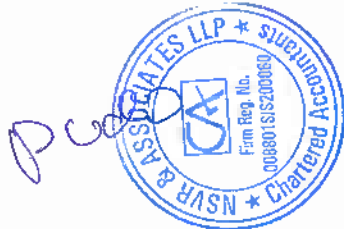
